All in favor. (Hailey) Earl is stepping down from the Executive Committee. Thank you for your service and dedication! Earl has been involved for a long time, and I hope he enjoys his retirement. There is a person that is interested in the Parent Sector Representative role which will be shared at the next meeting. Today I'd like to share everyone's prevention goals for 2026-2027. Starting with Anne. Goals include, attending North West Alcohol Conference (NoWAC) and continuing to research Kratom. (Anne) NoWAC is every other year. Having more city leadership attend would be beneficial. (Hailey) A lot of topics shared at that conference are trending. Having officers attend would be beneficial as well. (Anne) Would like to engage at conferences to further city-wide initiatives. For example, how Kratom is constantly evolving. Millennium Health Signal Report shares how Kratom use increased in every U.S region and doubled nationally. (Hailey) Susie was unable to attend today but her goals are: ELKS involvement with Junior ROTC and more involvement with the ELKS video, poster, and essay contests. Caylee, since you have participated in that contest any suggestions for getting more involvement? (Caylee) Mention there is a decent prize that may help incentivize more people to participate. Also sharing about the contest on social media. (Kati) She could share with Yoonwa with the West Ada School District (WASD) and Central District Health (CDH) to have a</p>

		<p>broader reach. (Danielle) Share on parent Facebook pages and forums. (Brenda) It can be posted on FYIdaho pages. Digital and print copies can be distributed. (Hailey) Jordan is unable to attend. Her goals: sharing more drug trends with the coalition. (Danielle) Youth are purchasing peptides online and selling them to their friends at school (with needles). After discussing it with an officer, the officer mentioned it's not illegal to purchase the peptides, but it is illegal to sell them since they don't have a business license. (Jake) A lot of peptide companies are Multi-Level Marketing (MLM) and they market in neighborhoods, outside of their homes, and online. (Danielle) There is an article on body dysmorphia and addiction to body image verses addiction to peptides. (Hailey) This is a good opportunity for a prevention bulletin. Jake, can you send me an article along with what peptides are, why they are popular, and the dangers to overusing them? (Jake) Yes. My goals are the same as last year. Finding someone to take over the Faith Sector Rep. role and get more faith engagement in National Recovery Month. (Hailey) Maybe reach out to St. Ignatius, Earl had good connections there. (Caylee) I also have connections there. (Hailey) Yoonwa and Tiffany goals: Natural High Campaign at sporting events, Red Ribbon Week involvement, Hidden In Plain Sight Trailer utilization, and school newsletter content. I did provide feedback regarding the Middle School lunches, that we'd like to have staff present during the lunches to monitor students. (Brenda) Also, it was disorganized. The school lunches I attended, the staff didn't even know we were coming. (Hailey) Any suggestions for Red Ribbon Week speakers? (Danielle) Maybe someone younger in recovery. (Hailey) As far as Back-to-School Nights and New Student Orientations, middle schools are the priority because that is the ideal time to have prevention conversations. (Danielle) Goals: more community involvement and volunteer opportunities. Also help with finding a Recovery Day Breakfast Speaker which is in the works. (Hailey) Yes, Lindsay Campbell is the 'new Danielle' at Northpoint & Imagine, she has 26 years in recovery. (Danielle) Lindsay will prioritize communication with the coalition. (Caylee) Hoping to find a Youth Sector Rep. replacement by July 2026. (Hailey) Multiple coalition members and Executive Committee members expressed how well Caylee has done to help the coalition. So, I would like to brainstorm to see</p>

It could be a Young Adult Subcommittee for a year to see how it goes? (Jake) MADC is lacking on the college side of things, and Caylee might be able to help bridge that gap. (Kati) We could call it “Youth and Young Adult Subcommittee” prioritizing high school aged youth and college students. The age-range can be discussed later, how long will this subcommittee run for? (Caylee) What does a subcommittee mean? (Hailey) A subcommittee is a group within a group that typically meets outside of regular coalition meetings. This subcommittee would be led by Caylee and myself and maybe one other member. The subcommittee then reconvenes to discuss ways to collaborate within the coalition. If this is something we’d like to do I will just need someone to make a motion. (Danielle) I motion. (Jake) 2nd. (Hailey) All in favor. Please reach out if you’d like to be involved. (Brenda) I would like to be involved as a mentor. (Danielle) Caylee will be able to connect with youth better than we can. (Brenda) Similar goals to last year, attending more events and getting involved with school and police department initiatives. One new goal – attend more MADC meetings in person. (Kati) Opportunities for the CATCH My Breath peer-teaches-peer model and Idaho Drug Free Youth to get involved with the “Youth and Young Adult Subcommittee,” develop a bi-annual trends report, mapping out violations and prevention curriculum implemented, and working with Jordan on having more community-led prevention media. (Hailey) MADC Annual Satisfaction Survey results, 7 responses. Any strategies to get more participation in this survey? (Danielle) Do the survey for the first 10 minutes of a meeting. (Hailey) Some highlights from the survey: a lot of positive feedback on field trips and guest speakers. Newsletters are useful and sent in a timely manner. (Kati) Maybe condense the newsletter. (Brenda) Including more links. (Kati) Maybe expand on the ‘Partners in Action’ section. (Hailey) The website is being utilized but the information could be scaled back a bit and updated. Something that stood to me is the questions regarding ‘do you feel valued as a coalition member’ and ‘are your contributions recognized?’ What are ways we make sure everyone feels valued at the coalition? (Danielle) People don’t feel like they have enough time to talk during the</p>

Under the ‘Topics to learn more about’ in the survey, the suggestions were: current trends, legislation, updated information on police reports for drug trends in the community and overlap of mental health and substance use. The question, “In your opinion, what are the most abused drugs in our community,” 1st Nicotine (Vaping) and Marijuana, 2nd Alcohol, 3rd Prescription Drugs and Other (2 responses for Kratom), and 4th Methamphetamine and Opioids (Heroin/Fentanyl). Last question, what prevention strategies/ programs are missing in our community: More youth-led prevention work and early intervention and elementary level. (Kati) Maybe having elementary education students trained in the student-teach-students model.</p>
